2025-26 Southern Indiana Japanese School (SIJS) Exchange Program Recruitment Summary

December 10, 2024

1. General Overview:

The Southern Indiana Japanese School (SIJS) in Evansville, Indiana, was founded when a Japanese company established a plan so that the children of the Japanese employees could study Japanese, social studies, math, and English using the textbooks used at the schools in Japan for the time they are in Indiana until they return to Japan. At present, children of employees from several companies attend SIJS. The University of Southern Indiana (USI) manages the school. We have about 52 students and 12 teachers. Most years, we need to hire one to six new exchange student teachers.

This exchange program provides a means for individuals who want to study abroad to study at the University of Southern Indiana (USI) to acquire a degree while teaching at SIJS. The cost of studying at USI is partially covered through this program.

2. Period of Study at USI:

The selected applicant(s) will study and teach for one year from approximately **July 26, 2025**, until around **June 27, 2026**. SIJS has 47 school days. The SIJS 2023-2024 calendar has classes on 42 Saturdays and five Fridays.

Applicants generally study and teach for a second year to acquire a degree, if eligible.

3. Volume of Recruitment:

At this time, SIJS expects to hire four to six new teachers.

4. Qualification to Apply and Study at USI:

a) Applicants need to have an associate's or bachelor's degree since they need to complete a bachelor's or master's degree in two years. Applicants must exceed USI's minimum score on TOEFL. Applicants' transcripts will be evaluated, and those considered to be able to pursue degrees at USI successfully will be selected. The applicant with the associate degree will pursue the bachelor's degree, and the applicant with the bachelor's degree will seek a second bachelor's degree or a master's degree. The applicant pursuing a master's degree may need to take the GRE/GMAT test, depending on the degree program. They might need to achieve a higher score on GRE/GMAT than the standard score. Current college students who have completed the credits of two years at college may apply for this program. Students must submit credential evaluations and submit original transcripts for admission purposes. We recommend utilizing any organization listed on the NACES website: National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES) member. Most students use Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE) or World Education Services (WES).

- b) Minimum test score to be admitted to USI is ibtTOEFL 71 or IELTS 6 for undergraduate students or ibtTOEFL 79 or IELYT6.5 for graduate students. - c) We want the applicants who wish to study at the College of Nursing and Health Professions to express their wishes when applying for this program. USI will decide whether the applicant is admitted to study at the College of Nursing and Health Professions or not after reviewing the transcripts from the university in Japan.

5. Courses and Cost:

USI waives the tuition up to the hours below for undergraduate, graduate and IEP. USI will also waive qualified fees as defined by the IRS for 1098T purposes. This includes lab fees, course fees, program fees, student activity fee, University Services fee, new student fees, and athletics fee. It does not include housing, books, medical insurance, and other non-qualified student fees.

The cost below is an <u>estimate</u> for the **2025-2026** academic year. Some costs will likely increase. USI pays only for the items below.

In the past, most IEP students were able to achieve the necessary English fluency in two semesters. However, some IEP students achieved satisfactory English in one semester. In this case, the individuals switch to the undergraduate or graduate course for **spring**2026. An individual is responsible for the 2025 fall semester tuition even if she/he completes IEP in one semester. If someone requires summer school to complete IEP, the individual is responsible for the additional summer school fee.

c) Other Costs:

- i. All costs not included above, including personal expenses, taxes, airfare, taxis, other travel, visa, TOEFL, etc., are the individual's responsibility.
- ii. If the applicant would like to live in the off-campus apartment housing after living in the on-campus apartment housing for one year, she/he can do that.
- iii. USI is located in the outskirts of Evansville. It takes about 8 minutes to go to the closest shopping center by car. The bus leaves USI main campus every 30 minutes on weekdays during the semesters. However, the bus does not leave the main campus during the summer vacation (between mid-May and late August), fall break, Thanksgiving holidays, and Winter Recess. During vacations and holidays, restaurants and fast-food stores are limited. During Winter Recess, no restaurant is available. Therefore, some students in the exchange program pay to buy a car and share the car. The students who do not own a car ask their friends for ride or use a taxi.
- iv. The health insurance that USI provides does not include insurance for the eyedoctor or the dentist. However, the students can purchase dental and eye-doctor discount card.

7. Classes and Visa Status:

- a) Undergraduate Studies: USI pays for up to 30 undergraduate credit hours per academic year for the individual who studies in the undergraduate course. Students may take up to 15 credit hours each in fall and spring semesters. Students must take a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester to meet the full-time status requirement for immigration purposes. Undergraduate students may take three hours in summer school if they take fewer than 15 hours in fall or spring. Students cannot graduate with an online class due to immigration requirements, so working with an academic advisor and the Center for International Programs is very important.
- b) Graduate Studies: USI pays for up to 18 graduate credit hours per academic year for the

individual who studies in the graduate course. Students may take up to nine credit hours each in fall and spring semesters. Students must take a minimum of six credit hours per semester to meet visa status requirements. The total hours required for completion varies from one graduate degree to another. Generally, a degree cannot be completed in two years by taking six hours per semester. Sometimes it is hard to take nine hours in the first fall semester. In that case, graduate students may take six hours in the 2025 fall semester and three hours in 2026 summer school. These three hours are included in the 18 hours that USI pays per academic year. Students cannot graduate with an online class due to immigration requirements, so working with an academic advisor and the Center for International Programs is very important.

c) Credit Hours and Degree: The student must consult their advisor to find out how many credits are required to complete the degree and what classes they need to take. The student must also visit the International Programs and Services for advice.

8. Class Withdrawal:

Class registration occurs before the semester starts. Occasionally, a student may need to withdraw his/her class after registration due to unforeseen circumstances. USI has a refund schedule that varies from a 100% refund to no refund, depending on how early in the semester the student withdraws from classes. Each individual is responsible for confirming the refund schedule each semester and is responsible for paying any portion of tuition not refunded. 11. Letter of Agreement:

We will send a Letter of Agreement (LOA) to the applicant in Japan before he/she travels to the US. The applicant must read the terms and conditions of the LOA for understanding. Then he/she will sign LOA if he/she agrees to the terms and conditions and will send it to us. The LOA terms and conditions will be updated annually to reflect tuition and fees changes, policies, processes, etc.

12. Document to Apply for Visa:

The application forms for visa will be prepared by USI. We will send the document for you to apply for the visa by May 29, 2025. We would like the applicants to apply for visa. The visa will be either F-1 or J-1.

13. Coming to US:

The selected first-year Student Instructor is expected to report to USI early enough to meet any applicable USI quarantine period and to attend orientation for the Student Instructors prior to the start date of July 26, 2025. USI housing is available for rent. USI classes will start August 18, 2025.
